ABORIGINAL CULTURAL EXCURSION

On Monday 28 October, Mrs Buhr, Ms Miller and Ms Ella took 45 Aboriginal students and 5 parents to Bulgandry Aboriginal site, Girrakool Picnic Area and Somersby Falls. Mr Dave Ella joined us and taught us many things about the site and the bush. We had a great day and enjoyed the day learning about the Aboriginal culture. Some of the students' comments are below.





Jayden

At Bulgandry there were interesting carvings in a rock. The animal carvings showed other Aboriginal people where to go to find good fishing spots and other carvings. I also learnt that some plants can be used as medicine to fix toothaches and headaches.

Cadence

I liked that there was lots of walking and looking at the rocks and the bush. I loved that we learnt how to survive in the bush in the dark. All the places that we visited were very interesting.

Aeisha and Jamie

We liked the waterfalls and how the water splashed and fell down the rocks. There was a hide out and walking in the bush made my legs hurt.

Claire

I learnt that the bush is like a supermarket and that the trees are like an air conditioner because if it's hot you can put your body on the tree and cool down. It was great to learn about different things and see what is around us.

Cooper

I learnt that one of the plants works like soap which is good to wash yourself and helps you hunt animals because the animals can't smell you.

Charbell

I learnt that at Somersby Falls there is a spot like a work shop and that's where they made and sharpened their tools. At Bulgandry there were interesting carvings on the rocks that showed you where to go to find different animals and also to find special places for men and women.
