COVID-19 UPDATES FOR TERM 4

Updated Term 4 Guidelines for Schools are being implemented.

Students who are unwell should not attend school. If students become unwell at school they will be sent to sick bay and parents will be notified to collect them.

Non-essential adults are still not permitted on school grounds or at school events. Our current drop-off and pick up procedures will remain the same as in Term 3, with physically distanced K-2 pick-up from 2:45 each afternoon. Social distancing is still required.

All adults that enter school grounds have to complete a COVID form and are only permitted to go to the front office.

If you need to pick up your child early you need to go to the front gate and ring the school. Students and their bags will be collected from class and escorted to the front gate for pick up. Unfortunately, this cannot happen between 2:45-3 due to K-2 student being collected.

Bubblers are still closed. Students need to bring a water bottle from home. These can be refilled in the classrooms when required. Each classroom has 2 black crates for drink bottles to be stored in and accessed when students are in the playground or at sport.

KINDERGARTEN ORIENTATION

Plans are underway to commence our Kindergarten Orientation program with some Covid-safe adjustments.

Two sessions are planned for Wednesday 4 and Wednesday 11 November, with the following arrangements to minimise non-essential adults in school. We are also offering an **optional** session for students on Wednesday 18 November.

School Planning:

- 1. A link to a short movie, "the day in the life of a Kindergarten student" was emailed this week. This will give yourself and your kindergarten child a snapshot view of the fun and exciting things that we offer at Woongarrah P.S.
- 2. Students who have siblings already enrolled at Woongarrah may arrive at school from 8:45-9am on Wednesday 4, 11 and 18 November. We ask that parents drop off at the front or side gate and that our existing students take their brother or sister into school and directly to the Kindy classrooms. We'll

have staff available to help. A brother or sister can stay and play until the bell goes at 9am. Please don't send students to school if they are unwell.

- 3. New families Parent / carer are requested to line up at the front gate on the yellow crosses to ensure social distancing with their child from 9:10 9:30am on Wednesday 4, 11 and 18 November. We'll have staff available to walk your child to class. Unfortunately, parent/carers are unable to walk with their child to the classrooms. Please don't send students to school if they are unwell.
- 4. All parent / carer information sessions will be conducted virtually eg Zoom meeting date TBA and information will also be provided in the Kindy Orientation pack in a school Library bag. Students will receive their Library bag on Wednesday 4 November.
- 5. Students need to wear sun safety clothes eg short sleeved tops and a hat and bring a water bottle, fruit break and Recess.
- 6. Students will compete activities in the classrooms from the time they arrive until 12:15 when they will be accompanied to the front gate for collection.
- 7. From 12:15, all parents / carers are asked to wait outside the front gate using the socially distanced markings on Mataram Road. As you approach the front of the line, we will call your child and bring them to you for collection.

Intention to apply for Year 7 placement in a selective high school in 2022

Dear Parent/Carer

Selective high schools cater for academically gifted students with high potential who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic standard. Selective high schools help these students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability, and by using specialised teaching methods.

Applications for selective high school placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and school assessment scores. The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday 11 March 2021.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2022, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

Detailed instructions on how to apply online will be available in late September 2020 at https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7.

The application website opens at that link on 13 October 2020 and closes on 16 November 2020. You must apply before the closing date.

There are no paper application forms. If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the Team for assistance after 13 October 2020.

You must submit only ONE application for each student.

The tear-off slip below is not an application and the school cannot apply on your behalf.





WHAT WE DID

We are a group of seven Year 5 students who have taken out **first place** in the Mathematical Association of NSW maths competition. We entered a real world inquiry project in the Year 5 class category.

OUR PROJECT

The project involved redesigning our school library to suit the needs of students growing up in the 21st Century. We discovered that there is a lot of maths involved in solving real world problems.

SURVEYS

We interviewed other students, teachers, Mrs Clarkson and Mrs Gilbert to find out what they wanted from the library. We discovered that learning zones were important. We then did a survey to get more specific data about types of zones and furnishings people wanted.





MAPPING

After researching what people wanted for our new library, we measured the space and drew a to-scale map. This proved tricky as we had to convert measurements, but we got there in the end.


Mr Smith even took us through using Minecraft to bring a 3D element to our design.

SHOPPING

We used the internet and catalogues to find furniture and kept track of pricing using Excel. This would eventually become our quote for the total cost of the redesign.

We then drew and cut to-scale models of the furniture and glued them in place onto our library map.


We took our design ideas to Mrs Gilbert and Mrs Clarkson for evaluation before sending in our project to be judged in the competition.



THE RESULT

Winning our category was very exciting. Our project is now in the process of being judged against the other states in the nationals competition in Perth and we are eaglery awaiting these results.

In the meantime, we have met with a furniture consultant who is bringing our ideas to reality. This new library is really going to happen. We had so much fun and learned a lot from this experience.
