# **END OF YEAR UPDATES**

We received updated Covid-19 guidelines for schools yesterday that has provided helpful advice for the remainder of the school year.

Many of the existing procedures remain in place. We will continue with our drop off and pick up arrangements, split recess and lunch times and non-essential visits are still not allowed.

Excursions – All excursions need to have a direct link to the curriculum and unfortunately our excursions to the Schoolhouse Museum (Year 1,2 History), National Park (Year 3, 4 Geography) and Sport and Rec camp (Stage 3 PDPHE) were cancelled this year. We have, however, organized a school fun day called 'Let Loose Day' that links to our PDHPE curriculum for all students K-6. Students will complete fun activities in stage groups throughout the day, organised by Be Skilled, Be Fit – a company who we have worked with in the past to conduct Commonwealth Games and Olympic Games days. The school is covering the cost of this event for students and we are looking forward to a fun day at school.

P&C Christmas event and P&C disco – these events are not possible within current guidelines. Fingers crossed for next year.

Presentation day - the updated guidelines do allow for parents to attend presentation day provided we have a Covid plan and adhere to the four square meter rule. We will let you know.

Year 6 farewell from Mrs Dempsey – I spoke to the Year 6 students yesterday about the notification sent last night and what they could be expecting for a farewell. At this point in time, we are still waiting on COVID safety plans from venues to determine what the farewell activity will be. Year 6 will still be recognised and celebrated as a farewell activity with times and venue to be confirmed. # 2021 STUDENT LEADERSHIP ELECTIONS FOR YEAR 5 STUDENTS

Each year, eight students from Year 5 are elected as student leaders for the following year and eight students are elected as sporting house captains. Mrs Dempsey will be holding a meeting with all Year 5 students next week about the leadership process. Year 5 will be able to 'interview' our current student leadership team to find out what the role of a student leader entails. The following information is important and will explain the nomination and voting process.

Eligibility for nomination:

- All students in Year 5 are eligible for nomination.
- Students who achieved Super Gold in the previous year are automatically eligible. Students who did not receive Super Gold must apply to the Student Wellbeing Team for special consideration.
- Similarly, if a student has been suspended, or has displayed a pattern of unacceptable behavior, the student must apply for special consideration on the grounds of a proven commitment to improved behaviour. The Student Wellbeing Team will make the decision.
- Students may only hold one leadership position.

### Nomination Process – Ministers

- Year 5 students nominate candidates. Self-nomination is allowed.
- Successful nominees prepare speeches to present to Year 5 and Parliament.
- Staff, Year 5 and Parliament vote to create a short list of 8 candidates.
- Candidates then present their nomination speech which will be zoomed to classrooms this year.
- All staff and all students in Years 3-5, plus the outgoing Year 6 ministers vote.
- Staff and student votes have equal weighting.
- Announcement of Parliament is made on Presentation Day.

Nomination Process - House Captain Elections

- At the first house meeting each year, nominations from Year 6 are called.
- All students in Years 3-6 have one vote each.
- Votes are made by a show of hands during the house meeting.
- The boy and girl who receive the most votes are elected as the House Captains.
- Ministers and SRC members are ineligible to run for the position.

#### Unacceptable behaviour when elected

Student leaders are role models within the school and are expected to set a good example at all times. Students who choose to disregard the school rules may lose their badge and leadership privileges for a period of time. Suspension results in an immediate loss of badge and position.

# FOCUS ON LEARNING TEACHER SURVEYS

Each year, students complete the Tell Them From Me surveys and teachers complete Focus on Learning surveys. I'd like to share our Teacher Surveys results this week.

24 teachers completed the Focus on learning survey in Term 3. The survey is a self-evaluation tool based on research around effective schools. Questions are scored on a 10-point scale. A score of 0 indicates strong disagreement with the questions, 10 indicates strong agreement, and 5 is a neutral position. The table provides a summary of our results.

# So what does this mean?

We use this information as part of our self-assessment, reporting and planning. Our results are very positive and you can see that responses are above state norms in all areas, with the exception of parent involvement which is lower than usual due to Covid-19. We look closely at specific questions to validate what we are currently doing and to look for areas to improve for the future. We look at changes in results across the years to measure the impact of some of our current work, for example Feedback and Collaborative Practice that have been focus areas within our three year plan. The survey results tell us that our actions are having a positive impact. Our scores have remained high over the past 5 years and improved over time and 96% of teachers believe that school leaders are effectively leading improvement and change. Areas to improve for the future include using technology to give students immediate feedback on their learning and sharing student learning goals with parents.
