COVID INTENSIVE LEARNING SUPPORT PROGRAM

There was some general information included in the (draft) newsletter yesterday about the COVID Intensive Learning Support Program that was provided for schools. However, it was not edited to reflect what is happening at our school, hence this separate advice, with apologies for any confusion.

The NSW Government has invested \$337 million in schools for this program, this year. Our school has received enough funding for us to employ three teachers for three days each week to work with small groups of students, targeted at the point of need, in Years 1-6.

Our work has begun. Our 'COVID ILSP' staff commenced on Day 1 and have spent the first few weeks looking at our assessment data, diagnosing needs, identifying the first priorities for support and further upskilling our expert staff. Small group tuition, with 2-5 students per group will commence next week. This will be delivered as intensive, regular, short, and sustained delivery three times each week, in class, during school hours, with ongoing teacher monitoring and regular check-ins.

An important component will be communication between home and school about this program and we will keep you informed as this program progresses throughout the year. The <u>department's website</u> also has more information on this program.

COVID-19 GUIDELINES FOR SCHOOLS – UPDATES

We continue to grapple with COVID-19 restrictions by following the guidelines that are issued to schools. We received feedback that parents were disappointed in not being able to attend the student leader's induction. I thought it might be timely to share the current guidelines as we had hoped to invite families to the student leaders induction assembly, but we are simply not permitted to do so. The current guidelines that are available at https://education.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/advice-for-families) state:

Parents and carers are not allowed on school sites or at off-site school events held during school hours except for the following purposes only:

- Essential parent and carer meetings with teachers and/or school executives, with a scheduled appointment. This includes scheduled meetings with parents and carers of prospective students.
- Parents and carers who attend a school administration building or another defined location for the purpose of picking up their child if they are unwell or where they have been asked to arrange for a COVID-19 test after their child has displayed flu-like symptoms while at school.
- Parents and carers who need to be on-site for canteen and uniform shop duties or to collect or purchase uniforms.
- Parent or carer volunteers required as educational support roles for activities essential to the delivery of the curriculum such as reading groups, music, dance and kitchen garden areas. Schools are required to

have scheduled programs in place and remind parents and carers that they must not attend school unless it has been previously arranged.

• Parents and carers can attend parent orientation meetings and 'meet the teacher' meetings with school staff for all year/stage groups. Meetings should be limited to 1 hour where possible. A COVID-19 Safety Plan must be in place.

My fingers and toes are crossed that we can soon see families back in our school. In the meantime, we are working really hard to consider every single event within the ever-changing guidelines in order to make student-centred decisions.

SCHOOL UNIFORM CLARIFICATION – SHORT SKIRTS

It was lovely to see so many students returning in school uniform this year. However, there are many girls wearing short skirts or tights that are not part of the uniform. We do not have a skirt option. Girls can wear shorts (unisex), navy or checked skorts or the school dress.

AN APOLOGY FROM FLEXI SCHOOLS

Jacqui in the canteen received the following apology from Flexi schools about the last two Fridays that she has asked us to share.

"We are writing to apologise for any inconvenience you and your parent community may have experienced as a result of the technical issues during peak ordering time on Friday 5 February 2021 and Friday 12 February 2021. On Friday 5 February, due to an issue at our cloud computing provider which affected multiple customers, users who were not currently logged into Flexischools were unable to log in. On Friday 12 February 2021, an intensive database operation was allowed to run which is ordinarily run in off-peak periods, resulting in the ordering experience for users slowing and, at some points, becoming unresponsive.

The two issues are unrelated and unlikely to reoccur.

In each case, our most senior technical staff were on hand to investigate and resolve these issues and, in addition to alerting you about the issue by email, we also placed a notice for any parents experiencing issues on the "System Availability" section of our Help page. Unfortunately, due to the inherent uncertainty surrounding these issues, they take some time to resolve.

Flexischools currently handles hundreds of thousands of orders every week and, during the peak ordering period on Friday morning, over 1,000 orders per minute.

Notwithstanding that it is inevitable that issues arise from time to time, the availability and reliability of our system is our highest priority and we take the investigation and remediation of these issues very seriously. We are disappointed that these issues occurred and we continue to work hard to prevent and mitigate issues such as these in the future. Please accept our sincere apologies for any inconvenience."

FREE LOWER LIMB ASSESSMENTS

The University of Newcastle Podiatry Clinic at Wyong hospital is offering children age 0-17 free lower limb assessments. Appointment times: Mondays from 2.30pm to 4.45pm until 31st May 2021.

Children will be assessed by final year students, supervised by a podiatrist. Assessment can include foot, ankle, leg and knee problems. Common reasons for consultation include warts, heel pain, night-time leg pains, rehab after ankle sprain and advice about flat feet. Advice can also be offered on footwear and normal development. 
Virtual Information Sessions
