Swim School Program – 5 spaces left

The Department of Education School Swimming and Water Safety Program is an intensive learn to swim program, which develops water confidence and provides students with basic skills in water safety and survival. The program is conducted over ten days from Monday 5 December to Friday 16 December 2022. Instruction will take place at Toukley Aquatic Centre Pool and each daily lesson is 45 minutes (1:30pm – 2:15pm). Travel will be by bus.

Cost \$50 (reduced from \$80)

Students in Years 2 to 6 who have not reached a satisfactory standard of water safety and survival skills and are unable to swim 25m confidently unaided in deep water are eligible to participate in the program.

Selective High School Placement Process for Year 7 2024

Applications for Year 7 entry to selective high schools in 2024 opened on 18 October 2022.

Applications will close on 16 November 2022. The due date is strictly observed. Requests for late applications will be approved only under very specific and well-documented circumstances.

All candidates are required to sit the Selective High School Placement Test to be held on Thursday 4 May 2023.

Earlier this term HB8 students participated in a mathematics investigation, exploring how they could win an Easter egg guessing competition using maths. The students worked very hard on the investigation where they came up with and explored two possible strategies for guessing how many eggs were in the jar.

The students' work was compiled and sent off to be judged in the Mathematical Association of NSW (MANSW) Investigating with Mathematics Competition in the Year 5 class category. Late last term we received notification that the students gained first place in their category. This was exciting news for the students and they were very proud to be state winners.

Their work was then emailed to South Australia, where it was judged against other state winners in the National Mathematics Talent Quest (NMTQ) and again received FIRST place!
