Attendance Awards

Aboriginal Education

Term 2 celebrates many significant Indigenous events. Our Stage 3 Aboriginal leaders led a powerful Sorry Day assembly on Friday 26 May to recognise the Stolen Generation. May 27 – June 3 marked Reconciliation Week and classes engaged in various activities to mark this event.

Cultural groups have continued every Thursday. The students engage in Dhinewan Mentoring in the even weeks and didge and artefacts/storytelling in the odd weeks. The students are currently learning traditional Aboriginal dances for NAIDOC Day in Week 10.

NAIDOC Day

NAIDOC Day will be celebrated on Wednesday 28 June (Term 2 Week 10). It will be a K-6 event at school. All parents and carers are welcome to the morning assembly that will include traditional dances performed by our Aboriginal students and a smoking ceremony. The assembly will commence at 9:15am under the COLA. Students can wear yellow, black or red clothes on NAIDOC day. After the assembly, students will complete Aboriginal activities in their classes or year groups.

WELCOME TO STEWART HOUSE

Every year, 1,600 public school children attend our safe haven next to Curl Curl beach at no cost to their parents or carers. During a 12-day stay, they are provided with dental, optical, hearing, and medical screening and treatment.

Children participate in educational programs and excursions designed to develop their social and emotional skills, build self-esteem and improve their overall wellbeing.

This experience provides children with a much-needed break from their current circumstances. Our children are inspired to see beyond the present and to have real hope and positive aspirations for their future.

Children in the care of Stewart House attend a specific purpose school onsite for 10 days of their 12-day stay. The NSW Department of Education provides infrastructure and staffing support for this school.

All other costs associated with the children's stay are met from charitable donations.

Athletics Carnival – Monday 31 July

Our annual athletics carnival will be held at Mingara on Monday 31 July. Students need to be at school by 8:30am as we will be leaving on buses at 8.40am sharp.

The 200m races will start the carnival at 9:30 am in the following order: Senior Boys, Senior Girls, Junior Boys (8,9,10), Junior Girls (8,9,10), 11 years Boys and 11 years Girls. During the 200m races students will stay in the stands with their house team. This will be the only time all students will be together on the day.

Once the 200m races are done the format changes. The following events are done in a rotation system designed to encourage participation. **No child will be in the stands** as they will move with their age group from event to event.

Age groups are determined by age that the children are turning in 2023.

100m races are age events - 8yrs, 9yrs, 10yrs, 11yrs and 12/13 yrs.

All other events are grouped as Junior Boys (8,9,&10yrs), Junior Girls (8,9&10yrs), 11 years Boys, 11 years Girls / Senior Boys (12/13yrs) and Senior Girls (12/13yrs)

The school will be using timing gates which are a computerised timing system. This new technology will eliminate the role of timekeepers and judges.

All results will be finalised after the carnival. Ribbons will be awarded to the fastest three times across all heats at the following assembly on Friday 11 August. This will be a 3-6 assembly.
