Curriculum Reform - Our focus for Semester 2

We are looking forward to a great term of learning together, with a strong focus on curriculum.

Our K-2 teachers and students will continue to unpack, explore, teach, and assess units of work for the new NSW English K-2 and Mathematics K-2 syllabus.

Years 3-6 teachers will be completing professional learning to examine new pedagogy, units of work and scope and sequence plans for next year when the new English and Maths Years 3-10 syllabuses become mandatory.

What have we done in semester 1?

In semester 1, we had a strong focus on Phonological Awareness in Kindergarten, Phonics in Year 1 and Reading Fluency in Years 2-6. Teachers:

- looked at data to identify gaps and areas that we could improve
- looked at the way that students learn and teachers teach in this area
- considered current research to review best-practice teaching strategies
- developed and implemented a plan for action, including fluency pairs in Years 2-6, and the Little Learners Love Literacy program in K and Year 1.
- Developed and implemented an assessment plan to measure impact

We look forward to sharing some of the results. This work will continue in semester 2, when we will also shift our focus to numeracy in the same way. We will also continue to evaluate a revised and updated assessment and reporting schedule that we have been trialling all year.

Curriculum Partnerships Schools Project Success

We have a relentless focus on curriculum at our school, led with expertise by our school leadership team and high-quality teaching staff. This was reinforced recently when our school was selected from many applications across NSW to be part of the Curriculum Partnerships Schools Project to co-design units of work for the new English syllabus for Years 3-6 in 2024.

Mrs Stanford, Assistant Principal, Curriculum and Instruction led the team with Mrs Khan (HB3) and Mrs Le Loux (HB7). They worked relentlessly for four weeks at the end of last term to design two units of work that will be used by teachers across NSW. The team behind the project was so impressed with their work, that they invited the school to nominate for another round, AND we were successful again! Congratulations to our team - Quality shines!

Curriculum-focused Feature Articles

I hope you have noticed the regular feature articles on Curriculum that are presented by our Assistant Principals Curriculum and Instruction, Mrs Stanford and Mrs Dempsey. Attendance - Every Day Counts Attendance Gauge


Semester 2 Statistics

Let us have a look at the Attendance Gauge for Term 2 at WPS. The Attendance Gauge is a visual reminder for everyone about the importance of student attendance and the link between attendance and learning. The research tells us that students with an attendance rate below 90% are educationally at risk.

You can find your child's attendance rate in the Sentral Parent portal. Fortnight attendance incentives will continue in Term 3. This term, all students with 100% attendance are entered in a drawer every fortnight, with one student per class drawn out for a CYBG prize. All names are then entered into a term draw where 10 lucky students will be drawn for special prizes selected by Student Parliament. One lucky family will also be drawn randomly for a \$50 Lowes voucher each fortnight. Congratulations to Liam's family in HB10 who were the lucky winners for Week 10 last term.

Our goal is 95% or above for every student.

NAPLAN

Parents of students in Years 3 and 5 will receive copies of Individual Student Reports for NAPLAN 2023 this week. The reports are different this year because from 2023, proficiency standards replace the previous reporting of student NAPLAN results that used numerical bands and the national minimum standard.

What are proficiency standards?

Proficiency standards describe what students are expected to know and should be able to do in literacy and numeracy at the time of NAPLAN. There is a proficiency standard for each test area eg: Numeracy, reading, Writing, Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation,



within each year level. Students' results are measured against 4 levels of proficiency:

- Exceeding: The student's result exceeded expectations at the time of testing.
- Strong: The student's result met challenging but reasonable expectations at the time of testing.
- **Developing:** The student's result indicated that they are working towards expectations at the time of testing.
- **Needs additional support:** The student's result indicated that they did not achieve the learning outcomes expected at the time of testing. They are likely to need additional support to progress satisfactorily.







Staff Development Day @ WPS - Learning for our Staff

Term 3 started off with a celebration of teaching and learning

for our staff. We had a showcase of the success of our Data Wise program. Classroom Teachers and Assistant Principals meet each week with Mrs Stanford and Mrs Dempsey our AP

Curriculum and Instruction leaders to analyse our student data, develop an action plan and enact the plan. Early Stage 1 had a focus on Phonological Awareness; Year 1 had a focus on Phonics; and Years 2 - 6 had a focus on Fluency in reading. Each group shared their learning with the rest of the staff which displayed what dedicated and passionate teachers we have at WPS.





Mrs Stanford led a session on the Big Ideas to Start Strong in

Mathematics where our teachers explored mathematical ideas and used maths resources to prompt this thinking. In the coming weeks, we will continue this professional learning on Maths.

Mrs Khan and Mrs Le

Loux shared with the staff their experience in writing the English units of work for the new 3 – 6 English Syllabus. It was an insight into how units are written and the time and resources it takes to develop quality teaching programs for our students. The units that Mrs Khan and Mrs Le Loux wrote will be used in schools across NSW from 2024.





Mrs Hindson shared

with the staff some professional learning on using Learning Intentions and Success Criteria in our teaching and learning. It was a great reminder to staff on what we want our students to learn and how they know they have been successful in their learning.

Mrs Dempsey led a session on quality teaching and Quality Teaching Rounds and what this looks like in our school.

Nearly all our teachers have participated in this powerful and collaborative professional learning. The session ended with our most recent participants, Mrs McLean, Mr Freyer, Mrs Corbett and Miss Foster, sharing their experience with the rest of the staff.


Our Student Learning Support Officers also had some professional learning on behaviour conducted by Mrs McGilvray and Mrs Beresford.




How to create an Audiri account

A guide on how to create an Audiri account and how to complete the registration process.

Follow the steps below to create an Audiri account.

- From your phone, navigate to the <u>Apple App store</u> (iPhone users) or <u>Google Play store</u> (Android users) and search for *Audiri* and download the free app.
- Once the download is complete, open the Audiri app, enter your email, and click on *Continue*.
- Click on Create new account.
- You will receive an email with a code. Enter the code on the app. (*If you do not receive the email within 15 minutes, please check your spam/junk folders. If it is not in your spam or junk folder, please visit <u>this page</u> for tips on how to troubleshoot the error you are experiencing.)*
- Enter your first name and last name and select what best describes you and click on *Continue*.
- Enter your phone number and click on Continue.
- Type in your school or organisation name.
- Select the school from the dropdown selections and click on *Continue*.
- Select the subscription groups and click on *Continue*.
- Create a new password and click on Set Password.
- Click on Start Exploring.

NAPLAN 2023 results: Information for parents and carers



What's changing?

From 2023, proficiency standards replace the previous reporting of student NAPLAN results that used numerical bands and the national minimum standard.

What are proficiency standards?

Proficiency standards describe what students are expected to know and should be able to do in literacy and numeracy at the time of NAPLAN.

There is a proficiency standard for each test area within each year level.

Students' results are measured against 4 levels of proficiency:

- Exceeding: The student's result exceeded expectations at the time of testing.
- **Strong:** The student's result met challenging but reasonable expectations at the time of testing.
- **Developing:** The student's result indicated that they are working towards expectations at the time of testing.
- Needs additional support: The student's result indicated that they did not achieve the learning outcomes expected at the time of testing. They are likely to need additional support to progress satisfactorily.



Has there been a change in what NAPLAN assesses?

No, there has not been a change in what NAPLAN assesses. NAPLAN continues to measure student achievement in numeracy, reading, writing, spelling, grammar and punctuation.

Your child's teacher can provide more information into how your child's NAPLAN result relates to their other school-based assessments and classroom learning, and any additional support your child might need.

Why has the reporting changed?

Proficiency standards provide clearer information about a student's NAPLAN achievement based on reasonable expectations of what students should be achieving at the time of testing.

The standards will allow you and your child's teachers to easily identify areas of strength, as well as any areas that may need more support.

How do I know if my child is meeting expectations?

A result in the *Exceeding* or *Strong* level means your child has met and/or exceeded expectations for their current stage of schooling.

A result in the *Developing* or *Needs* additional support level means your child has not yet demonstrated they are meeting expectations for their year level at the time of testing.


The results are simple to interpret and will allow you to easily identify areas where your child may require additional support.

How will proficiency standards appear on individual student reports (ISRs)?

The report shows 4 levels of proficiency -Exceeding, Strong, Developing and Needs additional support.

A student's result is shown as a black dot on an achievement scale for each assessment area, which shows increasing levels of knowledge, understanding and skills demonstrated in the assessments.

The new report continues to show each student's achievement against the national average (black triangle) and the range of achievement for the middle 60% of students in their year level (light green rectangle).



What skills are expected at each proficiency level?

Proficiency levels are set at a challenging but reasonable level expected for your child at the time of NAPLAN testing, based on what has been taught in previous years of schooling.

Page 4 of the ISR includes a summary of the skills expected at each level of proficiency.

Can I check my child's progress against previous NAPLAN reports?

Results from 2023 cannot be directly compared with results from 2008 to 2022 as:

- all schools now complete NAPLAN
 online
- the tests are held earlier in the year
- a new measurement scale that is more suited to the online tests has been introduced.
