

Gift Giving to School Staff

At the end of each school year, there are often expressions of appreciation in the form of gifts from families toward staff members. These are commonly to those who have cared closely for their children and these gestures are certainly appreciated.

There are some gifts that due to departmental policy, <u>staff members cannot accept</u>, e.g. cash, or items that can readily be converted to cash, or items with an estimated market value of \$50 or more (this sometimes occurs when a group of families pool resources to purchase a gift for someone), or where it could be perceived to be an attempt to obtain favour.

If you intend giving gifts, please be aware of the staff member's obligations according to the Department of Education policy, as refusing a gift can evoke uncomfortable feelings for both parties.

Christmas Craft

Each year we allocate a budget of \$10 per student for Christmas Craft activities. This provides students with some fun end of year activities. Every class order is different, but you can expect to see some nice Christmas keepsakes coming home in December.

Dance Lessons

Students K-6 have been enjoying our dance curriculum lessons with the Dance Curriculum company. This is a fabulous extra experience that we have funded in 2024 at no cost to families. We are looking forward to seeing the dances performed on Friday.

Swim Scheme spaces still available

As they are no longer required, HB19 and HB21 were removed from our site last week. Students enjoyed watching the enormous crane lift the demountables into the air and over the fence.






Grandparents Day – This Friday 8 November



K-2 Athletics Carnival – Thursday 14 November (Week 5)

We will be holding our K-2 Athletics Carnival between 9 and 11 at school. Students will be reminded of their house group and asked to wear on the day a shirt of their house group: Goanna – green Kangaroo – red Platypus – yellow Dolphin – blue with joggers, shorts, and their hat.

The day will start with students in house groups, with house chants and age races. Students will attend a House meeting to learn their team's chants on Monday 11 November. After the age races we will have a short fruit and drink break and then students will be organised into year groups to complete athletics carnival events e.g., egg and spoon races and relays. The carnival will conclude at recess and students will return to class. We aim to promote participation and engagement whilst participating in fun and safe activities. Parents and other family guests are invited to attend the K-2 Athletics Carnival.
