

#### Literacy and Numeracy at WPS

In the last newsletter, we looked at the tools and representations used to support additive thinking. This week we will show you how students use these tools to support them into the abstract world of maths.

When teaching students a new concept, it is important to build deep understanding using a systematic approach. In the early stages of learning something new, children need experiences with physical objects such as blocks, money, counters, measuring tapes, etc. As understanding develops, these concrete representations begin to be enhanced by visuals such as drawings or diagrams. These two stages support students to deal with the concept in more formal and abstract ways.

*Figure 1* shows the stages of developing a student's knowledge of simple addition using the concrete, pictorial, abstract approach. The use of colour is also effective as it helps the children visualise mathematical concepts and see connections between the representations.




