

English

In English, students have been learning about phonemic awareness and phonics through the Heggerty and Little Learners Love Literacy Programs. You may have heard of Milo Monkey! The have been learning letters and sounds and how to decode, segment and blend. Students have engaged with a range of high-quality texts including Starting School, We're Going on a Bear Hunt, Edward the Emu and the Book with No Pictures. These wonderful texts are used to build oral language, vocabulary reading and writing skills.





Mathematics

In mathematics, students have been learning to represent whole numbers, patterns combing and separating quantities, 2D shapes and 3D objects, data, forming groups, length, and mass. Students engage in daily Number Talks to build numbers sense, mental maths, and flexibility with numbers. In maths. lessons they learn to read, write, show, discuss and justify their mathematical ideas and solutions and connect maths to their everyday world.





Geography

Students have learned that people live in places and that these places are important to them. They look out how the location of places can be represented on maps.

Students developed an understanding of what makes a place special and that this might differ for different people.

Science

Students have been learning about what things are made of with Mr Vaughan. They sorted objects as being manmade or natural. They also explored what the best materials would be to make a raincoat, hats and/or a shelter and why.

Creative Arts

Students have been creative wonderful art works that link to the literature that the have been studying in English.

Stage 1 – Term 1 in Review

English

This term, Year 1 have explored a variety of rich texts to learn about context, narrative, character perspectives, arguments, and imagery. They have been building their reading and writing skills through the *Little Learners Love Literacy* program, with a strong focus on handwriting, spelling, and reading fluency.

Students have applied their learning in exciting literacy projects such as writing informative reports about animals and our local environment, creating imaginative stories, and building fantastic dioramas to match their writing.

They have also been developing their speaking and listening skills by sharing their ideas, listening to others, and participating in group discussions and presentations. It has been a wonderful term of learning, creativity and growing confidence in all areas of English.



Year 2 have been learning about Context, Narrative, Character, Perspective and Argument and Imagery, symbol and connotation while we looked at quality literature including "Welcome to Country", "The boy who wanted to shrink his name", "Where the Wild Things are", and "Koala ark". Students have also been reading and spelling using the Little Learners Love Literacy Program. Students have been writing simple, compound and complex sentences and learning about nouns, articles, adjectives, adverbs, conjunctions and time connectives.



Maths

This term in Mathematics, Year 1 have been building their confidence with numbers and developing strong foundational skills. Students have explored counting, place value, and simple addition and subtraction strategies using hands-on materials and number stories.

They have been learning to recognise, order and represent numbers up to 100, and have enjoyed using games and real-life scenarios to explore how numbers work in everyday situations.

Students have also investigated patterns, explored length and mass using informal units, and started to tell time to the hour and half-hour. They have been encouraged to explain their thinking and work together to solve problems, helping them build mathematical reasoning and confidence. It's been a fun and engaging term full of discovery, problem-solving and number sense!

Monster Challenge I see a herd of monsters Altogether they have 20 eyes 30 legs 10 tongues 40 arms How many monsters would there be? What would they look like?



Year 2 students have been learning about patterns, numbers, place value, two dimensional shapes, lines of symmetry, smaller numbers in bigger numbers, combining and separating numbers, data, length, area, volume and mass.

Geography

Students have been learning about the Features of Places. They looked at the weather, natural features and built features of our environments. They designed a park that included both natural and built features and discussed ways to look after the park.

Science

Students have been learning about Material World and what things are made of. They discussed the best materials to use when making

a waterproof item and redesigned face masks. They enjoyed making Play Dough.

Visual Arts

In Visual arts, students have created fantastic art works focussing on colour, line and space.









PDHPE

Students participated in the "Woongarrah Way", "Friendly Schools" and the "Resilience Project" programs to learn about the rules and expectations at school and about bullying. Students have enjoyed participating in Sport on Tuesday afternoon and are developing their fundamental movement skills. We have also had several events this term including Harmony Day and a visit from Healthy Harold. HB13 and HB12 enjoyed hosting the K-2 Assemblies this term. We are looking forward to the Easter parade on Friday.

On our Staff Development Day, teachers explored how breaking learning into manageable steps builds confidence and deeper understanding.
