Kindergarten – Term 2 in Review

This term, our Kindergarten students have continued to grow into confident learners, deepening their understanding of English and Maths while exploring the world through Geography, Science, Creative Arts and PDHPE.

In English, students engaged with a wide range of texts written for different purposes—some to inform, others to entertain. They learned to recognise story structure by identifying the beginning, middle and end, and used these skills to create their own imaginative and informative pieces. As they explored characters, they discovered how actions, illustrations and language help us understand how a character feels and behaves. Wordless picture books became a rich source of learning, allowing students to explore how meaning is conveyed through images, colour and layout. Toward the end of the term, they reflected on stories they already knew, expressing their own opinions and preferences using language drawn from shared texts.





Mathematics was hands-on and playful, with a strong focus on representing numbers, combining and separating quantities, and noticing patterns. Students explored measurement by comparing mass, length and size, and began learning that different tools are used depending on what is being measured. They also developed an awareness of time by discussing routines and sequencing events. Activities involving movement and position helped them describe how things move and change location. In addition, students began sorting and interpreting simple data, using their observations to talk about what they had discovered.

As part of their Geography lessons, students investigated the places they live in and belong to. They observed different features of places and explored how places can be used in a variety of ways. Discussions around belonging helped students connect personally with the spaces that are special to them.

Science had students exploring how things move. Through experiments and observations, they investigated push and pull forces and how these create motion. The focus on curiosity and discovery made these sessions especially engaging.

PDHPE lessons helped students develop self-awareness and emotional vocabulary through The Resilience Project. They learned about their unique strengths and how to manage different emotions in positive ways. In sport, students practised skipping and building their coordination and gross motor skills.

It's been a joyful and busy term of discovery, creativity and growth. We're so proud of the progress our students have made and can't wait to see where their learning takes them next.

Stage 1 – Term 2 in Review

Year 1

English

This term in English, our Stage 1 students have explored a range of rich and engaging texts that have helped build their confidence as readers, writers, and thinkers. They learned how authors represent people, places and ideas in stories, and practised retelling and sequencing events to support their understanding and story writing. Students made personal connections with texts by linking what they read to their own lives and the world around them, deepening their comprehension and growing their vocabulary.

They also discovered how pictures and images can play a powerful role in storytelling. By examining narratives where visuals help tell the whole story, students were inspired to create their own multimodal texts that combined words and images in creative ways. We looked closely at characters, exploring both how they look on the outside and what they feel on the inside. Students reflected on their own experiences to better connect with characters and understand how they are developed in texts.

To extend their thinking, students explored the use of imagery, symbolism and figurative language, learning how authors use these tools to create deeper meaning in imaginative stories. They also learned how language changes depending on the purpose of a text—for example, when writing to inform compared to writing to entertain.

It's been a wonderful term of learning, and students have made fantastic progress in building their literacy skills, confidence and creativity. Thank you for your ongoing support with home reading and encouraging a love of stories!

Mathematics

This term in Mathematics, our students have been exploring a wide range of number, measurement, and data concepts through hands-on activities, real-life connections, and playful investigations. We continued to build strong number knowledge by representing numbers in different ways and solving problems by combining and separating quantities. Students practised using flexible strategies to work with addition and subtraction and developed confidence in recognising patterns and place value.

Throughout the term, we explored measurement in meaningful contexts. Students compared the mass of different objects, measured length using informal and formal units, and told time using familiar events and language. They also learned that the purpose of measuring something helps determine which tool or unit to use.

We also investigated 2D shapes and position by describing where things are and how they move. Through engaging activities, students used mathematical language to describe and compare shapes, positions, and directions in everyday settings.

In our data and chance investigations, students learned to ask questions, collect and sort information, and interpret simple graphs. They began exploring chance by discussing everyday events that are certain, likely, or unlikely to happen.

Across all areas, students have been encouraged to use reasoning, problem-solving, and mathematical language to explain their thinking. It's been a fantastic term full of exploration and learning, and we're proud of the progress students are making in developing their mathematical confidence and understanding.

Geography

Students have continued their learning about the Features of Places. Students looked at how spaces are used. They also looked at maps of the classroom, school, and world. They have drawn maps with keys, looked at atlases and examined features of the world including continents and oceans.

Science

Students have been learning about the Physical World. They investigated different types of energy and how energy is used.

Music

This term, students learnt about musical concepts including beat, rhythm, dynamics, pitch, and different musical genres eg classical, pop. They also learnt about musical instruments, and they moved, sang and played body percussion to music.

PDHPE

This term, students engaged in the Resilience Project program, which focuses on developing skills in gratitude, empathy, and mindfulness. During one session, students explored the concept of conflict—what it is, how it can appear in different situations, and effective strategies for resolving it. These included identifying their emotions, expressing their perspective, actively listening to others, and working towards a compromise or seeking help from a mediator such as a teacher. In another lesson, students reflected on their personal strengths and character traits, identifying and sharing things they feel confident and capable in.

It has been a joy to watch our students grow academically, socially and emotionally throughout the term. Their enthusiasm for learning, curiosity, and developing independence have made the classroom a vibrant and positive space. We are so proud of the progress each child has made and look forward to continuing this journey of learning and discovery together.



Year 2


English

This term, Year 2 have been studying some interesting texts. At the beginning of the term, we started looking at texts from different cultures including Asian texts and Aboriginal texts. We looked at a hybrid text about sharks that included a narrative and information about sharks. Students wrote some great information texts about sea animals. We read and interpreted 'The Lion and the Mouse' and 'The Hare and the Tortoise' and learnt that some narrative texts have a moral or message. We have also studied and learnt to summarise a diary written by a fictional character that goes to Antarctica and students wrote informative texts about animals that live in Antarctica. Lastly this term, we looked at a text with no words that students had to interpret the story that was being told using the visuals and imagery. Year 2 have been learning about prefixes and suffixes in spelling and developing their vocabulary. In Writing syntax, students have written informative texts and have also learnt about verbs, adverbs and tense, adjectives and noun groups, prepositional phrases and figurative language as well as compound and complex sentences.











Maths

Year 2 students have been learning about equal means equivalence where one side the equation equals the other side of the equation, answering addition and subtraction using flexible strategies, collecting data and turning the data into graphs, deciding on the possibility of events happening in chance, forming groups and completing multiplication, how 2 dimensional shapes can be flipped, slid or turned and how the shape changes or not. Students also explored area, length, position and time. Students played barrier games and used positional terms.









Geography

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Visual Arts

In Visual arts, students have created fantastic art works focussing on the books that they have studied in English and special events.















PDHPE

Students continued to participate in the "Resilience Project" programs to learn about gratitude, empathy and mindfulness. A recent lesson involved students examining conflict, what it means and what it looks like and steps to resolve conflict that included recognising how you feel, saying what happened, listening to the other side and then discussing a compromise or getting assistance for mediation eg teachers. Another lesson looked at character traits and students discussed things that they are good at. Mrs Buhr, Mrs Johnson, Ms Miller, Mrs Morrison, and Miss Taki wish everyone a great Holiday. We are looking forward to another exciting term ahead.

STACE 2 - TERM 2 REVIEW

ENGLISH & MATHS

ENGLISH:

We learned about 'argument and authority' using the book 'Ned Kelly and the Green Sash.' We discovered how to tell the difference between who has authority and who writes a story. We practiced using persuasive language to create our own responses and texts.

We also explored 'imagery, symbol, and connotation' using the books "Bindi" by Kirli Saunders and "Fire" by Jackie French. We wrote our own poetry to express emotions and capture readers' attention.

MATHS:

We explored time, number systems, multiplication and division, chance, position, and measurement, building essential skills for everyday problem-solving and understanding.

MUSIC

This term, we have been immersed in an engaging music program, exploring beat, rhythm, pitch, melody, dynamics, and tempo. Through fun activities, we've learned to recognise musical symbols and timbre, enhancing our understanding of musical form. It's been a wonderful journey into the world of music!


